Alfonso, an American Cancer Society volunteer for more than 30 years, was elected Board Chair in 2019 and began his one-year term on January 1, 2021.

"While we are encouraged by the significant decline in cancer death rates across the U.S., statistics show that low-income communities and people of color continue to be disproportionately impacted by the disease," said Alfonso. "I am deeply honored to serve as 2021 Board Chair and am committed to working with Gary and his team, my fellow board members, and our 1.5 million volunteers in helping the Society advance its strategic priorities – among them, achieving health equity for all populations."

In 2014, Alfonso received the prestigious American Cancer Society St. George National Award, presented to outstanding community volunteers for their distinguished service in achieving the Society's strategic goals.
